The water we drink today is the same water the dinosaurs swam in! In the first week of this session, we'll investigate the many forms water takes as it moves in and around our planet. Expect many wet and wild adventures as we explore our pond, Rock Creek, and all things aquatic!

Do you love reptiles, amphibians, and fish? Then this is the camp for you! In our second week, we will focus on how these animals are alike and different, learn about their special needs, and compare them to their prehistoric ancestors.

Litter Critters & Secrets of the Forest

In the first week of the session, we'll explore the forest floor looking for creepy crawly insects, decomposers, arthropods, and other invertebrates! We will play games and make crafts to help us learn about the underworld of the forest and why it's so important.

There's more to a forest than what we see. Discover how trees talk to each other, how birds communicate with deer, and how ants protect plants in our second week.

Habitat Hikers & Prehistoric Prowlers




Scholarship Information

General Information

Audubon Naturalist Society (ANS) nature summer camps are designed to foster environmental awareness and expand natural and cultural knowledge. Woodend is a 40-acre oasis in the middle of Chevy Chase, MD. Bordering Rock Creek Park, the sanctuary contains mature woods and meadows, a pond, and an intermittent stream that provide habitat for many birds, insects, rabbits, and foxes. Open lawns provide activity space, and well-maintained nature trails permit safe nature exploration. All camps are taught by experienced environmental educators, maintaining a child-teacher ratio of 8-1.

Registration Information

Online registration opens Monday, January 24, 2022 at 10 am for ANS members. You can become an ANS member when you register for camp on January 24. Simply pick the member rate and add a family membership to your cart. If you are not a member when you register on January 24 we will charge a \$65 family membership to your account after we check membership records.

To Register:

- Click on Register Online and follow the prompts.
- You will have the option to renew your membership. Membership fees are nonrefundable.
- In an effort to reduce the number of forms parents must bring to check-in, we are including most forms as waivers in the registration process. Some waivers, such as sunscreen or transportation, may not necessarily apply to your camper due to age, but you must agree to all waivers to register. If you have any concerns, please email denis.perez@anshome.org after you complete your registration.

COVID-19 Policies

The health and safety of our campers is our top priority. By the start of camp, your camper must be fully vaccinated against Covid-19 and up to date on the vaccinations required by public schools. Covid vaccination cards will be required to be uploaded to the registration site 10 days before your camper's first date of camp.

Additional measures such as indoor masking, boosters, cohorting, and social distancing may be required based on the status of the pandemic. Any additional measures will be announced by April 11. Protocols are subject to change throughout the summer.

Before and after care will not be offered in 2022 (except for K camps to allow for the same dismissal times as other camps). <u>Drop off window will run from 8:45-9:15 am and pick up window will run 3:45-4:10 pm.</u>

ANS provides a waitlist for full camps. **Waitlists are free**. If a spot opens up in a camp, we will contact you and you will have 48 hours to decline or accept the spot. If the spot is accepted, payment must be made in 48 hours or the spot is forfeited.

NOTE: There is always a chance that spots will open up in a camp, so we encourage anyone who has some flexibility in his or her schedule to join the waitlist. We have no way of predicting which camps will have space open up, but in our experience, many camps have at least one cancellation. Due to the number of children registered for waitlisted camps, we will only contact you if space becomes available.

Your child cannot be enrolled in one session and waitlisted for the other concurrent session unless you want to pay the applicable cancellation fees if a spot opens up.

CONFIRMATION PACKETS

Your initial confirmation after you register online will come by email. ANS will **email** final confirmations including required health forms, camp policies, and carpool lists <u>approximately 2 weeks</u> prior to the start date for camps. **If you don't receive a confirmation email a few weeks before your child's camp begins, contact pam.oves@anshome.org.**

Note: Children who do not attend a U.S. school will need an immunization certificate by the start date of their camp. A copy of a school immunization record or one from your child's doctor will suffice.

REFUND POLICY BEFORE CLOSE OF BUSINESS APRIL 22, 2022

Your tuition is fully refundable <u>less a \$25 cancellation fee per week (\$50 per two-week session)</u>, provided that you submit your cancellation request in writing to the Education Office. You may email your cancellation to <u>pam.oves@anshome.org</u>.

REFUND POLICY AFTER APRIL 22, 2022

Cancellations must be made in writing at least 10 working days before the first day of the camp in which your child is registered, in order to be eligible for a 50% refund less a \$25 cancellation fee per week (\$50 per two-week session). You may email your cancellation to pam.oves@anshome.org.

COVID-19 REFUND POLICY

If ANS cancels your child's program due to COVID-19, you will receive a full refund for the missed days minus the \$5 registration fee, membership fees, and any scholarship donations. Should a camper need to miss camp due to a potential COVID-19 exposure in their household, no refund will be provided.

There will be no refunds for cancellations made fewer than 10 business days before the camp's start date. There are no refunds for missed days of camp.
