The world is a wonderful place to stretch the imagination. Campers will learn to express creativity with organic inspiration through drawings, paintings, crafts, and movement.


Water Works & Backyard Bugs

General Information

Nature Forward summer camps are designed to foster environmental awareness and expand natural and cultural knowledge. Woodend is a 40-acre oasis in the middle of Chevy Chase, MD. Bordering Rock Creek Park, the sanctuary contains mature woods and meadows, a pond, and an intermittent stream that provide habitat for many birds, insects, rabbits, and foxes. Open lawns provide activity space, and well-maintained nature trails permit safe nature exploration. All camps are taught by experienced environmental educators, maintaining a child-teacher ratio of 8-1.

Registration Information

Online registration opens Monday, January 30, 2023 at 10 am for Nature Forward (formerly ANS) members. You can become a Nature Forward member when you register for camp on January 30. Simply pick the member rate and add a family membership to your cart. If you are not a member when you register on January 30 we will charge a \$65 family membership to your account after we check membership records.

- Full payment with a credit card is due at the time of registration.
- Membership fees, registration fees (\$5 per camp), and scholarship donations are non-refundable.
- You may register for a maximum of five weeks. Two-week sessions will not be pro-rated for one-week attendance.
- You may not enroll a non-family member/child's friend under your account.
- No prorated rates are available.
- Full and partial scholarships are available. Please email <u>denis.perez@natureforward.org</u> for more info.
- All camps have a five minute grace period and \$1/minute/child late fee thereafter for pick-up after 4:10 pm.

WAITLISTS

Nature Forward provides a waitlist for full camps. **Waitlists are free**. If a spot opens up in a camp, we will contact you and you will have 48 hours to decline or accept the spot. If the spot is accepted, payment must be made in 48 hours or the spot is forfeited.

NOTE: There is always a chance that spots will open up in a camp, so we encourage anyone who has some flexibility in their schedule to join the waitlist. We have no way of predicting which camps will have space open up, but in our experience, many camps have at least one cancellation. Due to the number of children registered for waitlisted camps, we will only contact you if space becomes available.

Your child cannot be enrolled in one session and waitlisted for the other concurrent session unless you want to pay the applicable cancellation fees if a spot opens up.

CONFIRMATION PACKETS

Your initial confirmation after you register online will come by email. We will **email** final confirmations including camp policies and carpool lists <u>approximately 2 weeks</u> prior to the start date for camps. **If you don't receive a confirmation email a few weeks before your child's camp begins, contact <u>pam.oves@natureforward.org</u>. Health forms will be emailed in April and must be returned at least one week before camp begins.**

Note: Children who do not attend a U.S. school will need an immunization certificate by the start date of their camp. A copy of a school immunization record or one from your child's doctor will suffice.

REFUND POLICY BEFORE CLOSE OF BUSINESS APRIL 21, 2023

Your tuition is fully refundable <u>less a \$25 cancellation fee per week (\$50 per two-week session)</u>, provided that you submit your cancellation request in writing to the Education Office. You may email your cancellation to <u>pam.oves@natureforward.org</u>.

REFUND POLICY AFTER APRIL 21, 2023

Cancellations must be made in writing at least 10 working days before the first day of the camp in which your child is registered, in order to be eligible for a 50% refund less a \$25 cancellation fee per week (\$50 per two-week session). You may email your cancellation to pam.oves@natureforward.org.

COVID-19 REFUND POLICY

If Nature Forward cancels your child's program due to COVID-19, you will receive a full refund for the missed days minus the \$5 registration fee, membership fees, and any scholarship donations. Should a camper need to miss camp due to a potential COVID-19 exposure in their household, no refund will be provided.

There will be no refunds for cancellations made fewer than 10 business days before the camp's start date. There are no refunds for missed days of camp.
