

Do you know who the prowlers of the Mesozoic era were? Dinosaurs! In this camp we will learn about the different adaptations that made dinosaurs so successful and what we can learn about them through their fossils.

The natural world is a wonderful place to stretch the imagination. Campers will learn to express their creativity and inspirations through drawings, paintings, songs, and movement.

Secrets of the Forest & Sensational Science

Fairvtale Forest & Habitat Hikers

Outdoor Skills & Farm to Table



We will spend Monday and Tuesday at the Sanctuary learning how to pack our gear and mapping our route. We will leave on Wednesday for a three-day, two-night trip where we will cover roughly 24 miles of the Appalachian Trail. Hiking boots (with ankle support) and a backpacking pack are required.

Every child deserves to enjoy a safe and welcoming environment at camp. Children are expected to follow the 5 Camp Woodend Rules: Be Safe, Be Responsible, Be Respectful, Be Kind, and Have Fun. This includes interacting respectfully with people from cultures or belief systems different from their own and refraining from bullying or intimidation.

Inappropriate or unsafe behavior, as determined by the camp staff or Director, may result in any or all of the following actions:

- Camper will be given a reminder of the rules and redirected towards more appropriate behavior.
- Camper will be given reasonable choices to modify behavior.
- Camper will take a supervised "cooling off" period away from the group.
- The camp director or the assistant camp director will meet with the child.
- Parental notification.
- Partial or total suspension of the child from camp.

Scholarship Information

Full and partial scholarships are available for campers who qualify for Free and Reduced price Meals (FARMS) or who are referred through a school counselor. Extended camp is open to all campers Grade K through 6. Extended camp provides participants with a fun, relaxing end to their vigorous day at summer camp. Activities include crafts, outdoor games, quiet time for books, and cards. We provide a snack of goldfish crackers as well. Sign up when registering for camp and <u>make sure to pick</u> <u>both weeks if you are signing up for a two-week</u> <u>session for Grades 1-6</u>. Extended camp spots are limited and we cannot guarantee a spot. Extended camp for K camps only runs until 3:45 pm. Due to licensing regulations and space, we can't offer an extended camp option until 5:00 pm for K campers.

General Information

Nature Forward summer camps are designed to foster environmental awareness and expand natural and cultural knowledge. Woodend is a 40-acre oasis in the middle of Chevy Chase, MD. Bordering Rock Creek Park, the sanctuary contains mature woods and meadows, a pond, and an intermittent stream that provide habitat for many birds, insects, and mammals. Open lawns provide activity space, and well-maintained nature trails permit safe nature exploration. All camps are taught by experienced environmental educators, maintaining a child-teacher ratio of 8-1.

Online registration opens Thursday, January 23, 2025 at 10 am. You can become a Nature Forward member when you register for camp on January 23. Simply pick the member rate and add a \$65 family membership to your cart. Nature Forward members receive special pricing.

Wellness and Covid

The health and safety of our campers is our top priority. By the start of camp, your camper must be up to date on the vaccinations required by public schools. Camp Woodend follows MCPS policies and CDC guidelines for masking, isolation, testing, and other recommendations. Protocols are subject to change throughout the summer.

Note: Children who do not attend a US school will need an immunization certificate by the start date of their camp. A copy of a school immunization record or one from your child's doctor will suffice.

Payment and Confirmation Information

- Full payment with a credit card is due at the time of registration.
- Membership fees, registration fees (\$5 per camp), and scholarship donations are non-refundable.
- You may register for a maximum of five weeks. Two-week sessions will not be pro-rated for oneweek attendance.
- You may not enroll a non-family member/child's friend under your account.
- No prorated rates are available.
- Full and partial scholarships are available. Email **brenna.houck@natureforward.org** for more info.
- All camps have a five minute grace period and \$1/minute/child late fee thereafter for pick-up after 4:10 pm or 5 pm for Extended Camp grades 1-6.

WAITLISTS

Nature Forward provides a waitlist for full camps. **Waitlists are free**. If a spot opens up in a camp, we will contact you and you will have 48 hours to decline or accept the spot. If the spot is accepted, payment must be made in 48 hours or the spot is forfeited.

NOTE: There is always a chance that spots will open up in a camp, so we encourage anyone who has some flexibility in their schedule to join the waitlist. We have no way of predicting which camps will have space open up, but in our experience, many camps have at least one cancellation. Due to the number of children registered for waitlisted camps, we will only contact you if space becomes available.

Your child cannot be enrolled in one session and waitlisted for the other concurrent session unless you want to pay the applicable cancellation fees if a spot opens up.

CONFIRMATION PACKETS

Your initial confirmation after you register online will come by email. We will **email** final confirmations including camp policies and carpool lists <u>approximately 2 weeks</u> prior to the start date for camps. **If you don't receive a confirmation email a few weeks before your child's camp begins, contact <u>pam.oves@</u> <u>natureforward.org</u>. <u>Health forms must be completed one month before camp begins</u>.**

REFUND POLICY BEFORE CLOSE OF BUSINESS APRIL 18, 2025

Your tuition is fully refundable less a \$50 cancellation fee per week (\$100 per two-week session), provided that you submit your cancellation request in writing to **pam.oves@natureforward.org**.

REFUND POLICY AFTER APRIL 18, 2025

Cancellations must be made in writing at least 10 working days before the first day of the camp in which your child is registered, in order to be eligible for a <u>50% refund less a \$50 cancellation fee per week (\$100 per two-week session)</u>. You may email your cancellation to **pam.oves@natureforward.org**.

If Nature Forward cancels all or part of your child's program for any reason, you will receive a full refund for the missed days minus the \$5 registration fee, membership fees, and any scholarship donations.

There will be no refunds for cancellations made fewer than 10 business days before the camp's start date. There are no refunds for missed days of camp.
